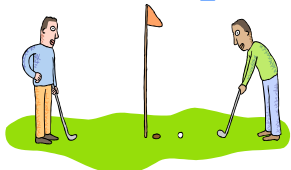

FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

Again I want to thank the MGA, MWGA, Brian Hagewood and Wayne Reed for the work and contributions for the downstairs paint and carpet. This was a much needed improvement.

Starting in 2012 as part of our plan to grow membership the BOD offered incentive plans for new members on a trial basis. While there was a financial need we also wanted to give our new members time to participate in the club before they took the next step to becoming a full active member. We moved the trial members to the associate classification as their contracts expired, which was done to ease the step to a full active member. The Associate classification has reduced monthly dues and until 2017 a waiver of trail and cart fees.

The BOD voted to bring trail and cart fees to the Associate classification but with no change in monthly dues starting in 2017. By taking this step we were able to take a small reduction for all members. I understand the feelings many of you might have that were not paying trail or cart fees. MCC needs your support and understanding. The BOD's goal is to make membership equitable for all members. If we can continue to grow our financial strength we will be able to continue making improvements and hopefully reduce the cost of membership, but it takes time and working together.

The BOD also voted to require **all golf carts** to have a sticker if your cart is **going to be on the golf course**. While revenue and equity was part of the discussion the driving force for this requirement is security. Without the sticker we do not know whether or not this is a member's cart or someone that is trespassing. The cost of the sticker is \$35.00, which is waived for members required to pay trial fees. The BOD reserves the right to assess anyone that violates this rule. You may pick up your sticker from Cary or Lisa.

Hopefully you have seen the improvements that are underway on the golf course. Several of the areas along the 6th and 7th fairways 1840 have been cleaned. We are also in the process of getting rid of equipment that has not been used in years to make room for equipment in use. Many of our projects are cosmetic but as the year goes on you will see other improvements!

I want to thank all of you for your support of our club.

TURF TALK

Greetings from MCC Turf Grass Department,

I hope everyone had a wonderful Holiday Season and Happy New Year. 2017 is going to be an exciting time for the golf course, I am so proud and thankful to be back and a part of MCC. I would first like to take this time to thank each member of the club for your support and giving me the opportunity to help make MCC the Championship golf course it's designed to be.

We have a lot of hard work ahead of us and there is much to do. As you know, during our growing season, most hours are spent mowing and general up keep of the course is a non-stop effort. With that said, several items or task may be neglected or simply not enough time in the day to perform, so we are utilizing the winter months to organize, clean, and prepare for the upcoming golfing season. This month we have performed a total "house cleaning" if you will, in and around the maintenance areas or ammo bunkers between holes 6 and 7. This included taking pesticide inventory, equipment inventory, and re-organizing our space to help aid in our efficiency and overall appearance of our department. We also our presently taking inventory and performing routing maintenance of all pin flags, tee markers, ball washers, etc., we are a championship golf course so the functionality and aesthetics of these small items are very important as well. This month we are also implementing our debris and tree management plan. Our goal is to manage and eliminate any dead, unwanted, sick or diseased, trees, especially hazardous ones, as well as prune and beautify them all around the course.

January weather so far has been typical winter month, dreary and wet. The small clump plants on the greens, poa annua, aka annual bluegrass is not only hinder your ball on the putting surface, but is unsightly as well. Treating the poa is top priority for us and we do plan on spraying asap, we first must have dry and warmer weather. We do treat this chemically with herbicide, but an FYI, it can be treated mechanically. Meaning, it can physically be removed with a divot repair tool or pocket knife. So, I urge each of you winter golfers to pluck the individual plants, if only a few, each time you are on the greens. I think everyone will be surprised how effective this is and it can save dollars by not having to apply herbicides. We are teaching our staff the same practices while they are working on or around the greens.

I'm sure there is much frustration and questions concerning the bunkers. Not to worry, we will be troubleshooting and flushing the outfall drainage lines exiting each bunker beginning in February. There are 58 total bunkers on the course and approximately half are not functioning properly and they all need edged. Once the outfall pipes are flushed and we know they are working, we will begin to check sub grades, edge, and execute proper routine maintenance on all of them. A more accurate time frame for a scheduled completion will be communicated once we get in them to identify their problems, almost a bunker by bunker case scenario, we appreciate your patience, our goal is to have them playable by spring. We are also going to be addressing greenside drainage issues in February, we want all green surrounds to be firm and true.

There is much to do as mentioned, but it can and will be achieved. Again, thank you all for your support and encouragement. This is going to be a great year and I urge each of you to find me on the course and introduce yourself. I'm very excited and all of us in the MCC turf grass dept. can't wait to provide all of you with Championship conditions.

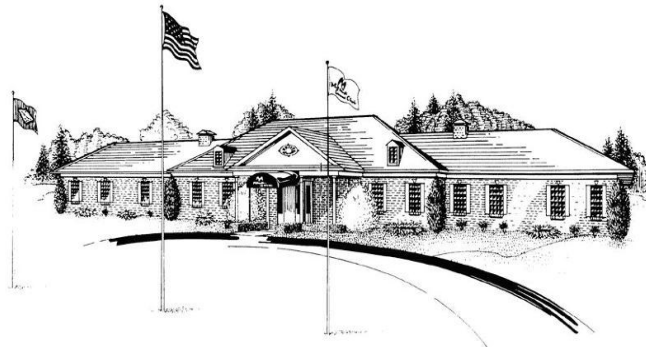
